Many of our friends ask how they may help.


First, your continued **prayers.** This is the most powerful weapon that may be used against enemies, and IT WORKS.

Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

"Love you enemy and do good...Be compassionate, as your Father is compassionate"

Luke 6: 35-36

On this Sunday, our Holy Church provides us with two very meaningful passages from the Scriptures. This Gospel reading encourages us to exercise true love for everybody, including our enemies. This kind of love had never been preached before Christ. No religion, except Christianity, has this teaching about the love we must have for others, expecting nothing in return. Even the Old Testament said nothing similar about this love, but instead taught "an eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth..." (Exodus 21:24). Christ Our Savior elevates our human relationships one level higher. He Himself demonstrated this example of such love while he was dying on the Cross. He asked his Father (God) to forgive His murderers "for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23:34). Indeed, this kind of love is not easy to find in our society; but this is a certainly: We have to implant this type of love into our hearts.

To exercise love to all is not an easy task; it requires complete trust in God, reliance on His commandments, humbleness and a strong belief that whatever we have is not ours but God's. Unfortunately, we do not see this kind of trust in God very often. People have to believe in the words of Christ, and not just listen to them. Until we realize that Christ died for <u>us</u> and called <u>us</u> to inherit His Kingdom, we are unable to work fully for the inheritance that He promised us. Therefore, let us break up the hardness of our hearts and let God reside there, as this will definitely bring us closer to our salvation.

The "Golden Rule" given by Our Lord in today's Gospel reading brings our attention to our relationships with the rest of the world: "Do to others what you would have them do to you." (Luke 6:31). Without doubt, this rule makes our minds sober and our deeds reasonable as we realize that the same attitude we demonstrate to others will eventually be turned back on us by God. If we build our relationship with God and people on the basis of love, we will be called the children of the Most High; and this is the main thing for us to understand on this Sunday. Remember... We shall be saved only by acts of mercy. If we show no mercy, we shall receive no salvation.
