

Breaking down Walls

A new prison was completed with much of the labor being done by the prisoners themselves. The modem structure was to replace the old prison, which had housed prisoners for over a century. After all the inmates were relocated to the new facility, those same prisoners were enlisted to tear down the old prison. They

removed all the old piping and lighting fixtures and then were told to knock down the walls. Much to their shock and dismay, they discovered that the walls were made only of paper and clay! The walls were painted to look like solid stone, but could have easily been knocked out by a few hard kicks. For over 100 years every prisoner could have easily escaped from his cell but never attempted to do so because he thought he was confined by solid stone walls!

Ever since the fall of Adam and Eve, mankind has been held captive as prisoners of death. Christ came to liberate us from our death sentence and to release us from our prison. By His death he defeated death and granted us each the gift of immortality!

The Myrrh-Bearing women were first-hand witnesses to this marvelous event. They were the first to see that the tomb which imprisoned the lifeless body of their Lord had been opened! The stone had been rolled away! An angel seated in the tomb asked them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" "He is not here; He has been raised!" (Mark 16:6) Let us continue to celebrate the joy of the Resurrection of our Lord!

Today; Myrrh-Bearing Women

On this Third Sunday of Pascha we honor the Myrrh-Bearing Women who at deep dawn went to the tomb to anoint the body of Christ with ointments, discovered the tomb empty, and received the announcement from the angel that Christ is Risen!

Liturgical Custom

Please remember that during this Paschal Season, and continuing until Pentecost Sunday (even throughout the week), we do not kneel during the Divine Liturgy. Kneeling is a sign of penance and contrition – but the joy of Pascha is so much greater in this season that we stand in celebration instead.
