

Why had God sent Elijah to Ahab in the first place?



The holy and glorious prophet Elijah



"...a fiery chariot, and fiery horses parted them both asunder, and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven."

2 Kings 2:11

After his ministry on earth, the holy prophet Elijah (Elias) was taken up to heaven in a fiery chariot. He is therefore known as the patron saint of vehicles, reminding us that we must struggle to manifest holiness in our lives, especially when we travel. Just as we have our homes blessed each year, everyone is encouraged to bring their vehicles on this day for this special service as we commemorate the prophet Elijah and his ascent up to heaven in a fiery chariot, and also to commemorate the conversion of the

Ethiopian, who was reading scripture while in his chariot.


Mark your calendars for the Feast of the Dormition of the Mother of God...




For the past several years, we have been celebrating in our parish family, with great solemnity, the Falling Asleep-Dormition of Our Lady the Most Holy Theotokos. Our Church greatly honors Mary because she, a human like us, was chosen to give birth to the Son of God. As one of the hymns declares: "By singing praise to your maternity, we

exalt you as a spiritual temple, Theotokos. For the One Who dwelt within your womb, the Lord who holds all things in His hands, sanctified you, glorified you, and taught all to sing to vou...'

The Holy Passion-Bearers Boris and Hlib

On Friday, July 24th, we honor in our Holy Church the first glorified/canonized saints-martyrs of our Ukrainian Church, the holy Passion-bearers Boris and Hlib. Who are these two brothers? How did they die?

Boris (in baptism David) and Hlib (in baptism Roman) were brothers by the same mother. Their father the great prince Volodymyr-Vladimir, before his baptism, had numerous wives and many children by them. Hence, Vladimir divided up the state among all of his sons before his death, and after his death the eldest son, Sviatopolk, became Prince of Kyiv (the main city of the state, Kyivan Rus'-Ukraine). But still Sviatopolk was jealous and wanted yet more power, and he

planned to kill his brothers in order to gain their territories. Some of Vladimir's advisers told Boris that he should take the army and establish himself as ruler of Kyiv. The holy martyr Boris, however, said that he could never lift his hand against his own brother. Sviatopolk sent assassing to kill Boris, who already knew that his brother wanted him dead. When they arrived, they heard him chanting psalms and praying before an Icon of Christ. He asked the Lord to strengthen him for the suffering he was about to endure. He also prayed for Sviatopolk, asking God not to count this against him as sin. Then he lay down upon his couch, and the assassins stabbed him with their lances.

After Sviatopolk had killed Boris, he sent Hlib a message saying that their father was ill and wished to see him. As he was on his way, he received word that their father had died and that Sviatopolk had murdered Boris. The holy martyr Hlib wept for his father and brother, and was lamenting them when the assassins arrived. They seized his boat and drew their weapons, but it was Hlib's cook who stabbed him with a knife. The martyr's body was thrown onto the shore between two trees. Later, he was buried beside his brother St. Boris in the Church of St. Basil the Great. Although Boris and Hlib were not martyred for their faith (they are properly called 'passion-bearers' rather than martyrs), their voluntary and meek sacrifice for the sake of averting the suffering of others and preserving the Christian ideal, had a profound effect on the subsequent development of Christianity in Ukraine and the entire Eastern Church.
